<u>Grading:</u> This year, students will get a number grade out of 100 on each report card. There are 4 marking periods, and every 10 weeks, a report card is sent home, with a progress report sent at the half-way mark. ELA assignments will fall into one of these categories that make up the ELA report card grade:

- Work Habits 10%: work completion, reading response journal, participation, preparation
- Guided Practice 40%: grammar practice, teacher-assisted, group and partner classroom activities
- Independent Performance 50%: comprehension checks, weekly grammar checks, writing tasks

<u>Fridays</u>: At DMS, we want to build and maintain a life-long love of reading <u>for pleasure</u>. "Reading" does not have to be associated with boredom, torture, eye-rolling, loud sighs, or anything negative. Some of us read to relax, enjoy a good story, or learn something new. I am a nutrition geek and read about nutrition *for FUN*. I do! I also love psychological thrillers, true crime, or fictional mysteries full of mind-blowing plot twists! On Fridays in ELA, students will read independently for 20-25 minutes. Anything they want- I have shelves upon shelves of books and so does the library, but feel free to bring in books from home. At the end of class, students will respond in a journal about our weekly topics and what they chose to read.

<u>Core Units</u>: We are using the ELA program called **MyPerspectives** by **Savvas Realize**. This comes with a soft cover Interactive Student Edition that can be written in! I also post the PDF of each unit in our Google Classroom. I do have some extras if parents would like to borrow a copy to look over. We plan to cover the following 6th grade units:
