<u>Materials:</u> Hybrid learners, each school day, you should have your chromebook, a pen or a pencil and your composition notebook (I can provide you a notebook if you need one). I am planning to keep as much digital this year as possible. For online learners, everything will be in google classroom for you.

Course description:

In this course, our goal is to acquire spanish language. "Acquiring" a language is very different from "learning" a language. Acquiring is something that happens TO you instead of something that you make happen. When you learned how to speak your first language, you acquired it naturally by listening to other people speaking it around you for a long time, not by studying it. Therefore almost all of our class time will be spent using spanish, not using English to talk about Spanish. The focus of this class will be on listening and reading. We will also do some speaking and writing but I expect you to make mistakes so you will not be graded as heavily on those skills. Please do not use google translate or any other translator apps, they will not help you. I will give you the words you need in our lessons and you should use those words when writing or speaking, learning a language is a slow process and it won't help you to just translate paragraphs or pages at a time, trust me to give you the vocabulary you need.

We will focus our class time on the acquisition of high frequency structures (The most frequently used words in a language). We will use these structures in class discussions, stories and cultural explorations. Before your year ends, we

will read two class novels together, these will be available online and I can also provide paper copies to any student who wants one.

Class expectations - your keys to success:

Because I have high expectations for you, I also have high expectations for myself. I expect you to be respectful, responsible and safe students and I will in turn be a respectful, responsible and safe teacher. I am a rule follower, I will be enforcing all the school rules.
