Technology Class

Eighth grade students have been working hard in our Aerodynamics and Flight Unit. We just got done with our balloon lab where we tested the properties of air using balloons in different stations. One major station that can be seen in our first picture was to see how many helium balloons it takes to lift up a ruler.

We also released some helium balloons outside with some pre-written notes saying we would like our balloons returned to school and asking for a return note saying where the balloon was found. Both of these stations were meant to show the properties of air and its affects on flight.

Students have learned many different techniques and used many different types of tools in this robotics project.

The sixth grade robotics classes are hard at working creating different props to match their robotics' track themes. 
Current events for student council include:
