

The National Guard came into Physical Education classes and worked with all of our students with the Gears Plus program activities. These activities consisted of a variety of


challenges that

8th Grade Science

Living Environment students have been finishing a unit on photosynthesis and cellular respiration. They had a great time playing the game "Bloom or Doom." These students also started a one month plant study using Wisconsin Fast Plants and different amounts of fertilizer. With the help of retired Dryden science teacher, Carole Erslev, the L.E. students planted their own plants and have been

measuring plant height daily, watering them, studying leaf area, and even pollinating the plants themselves with real bees. These plants go through the entire plant life cycle in a short amount of time, and they will conclude with counting seed pods produced by the plants from their pollination efforts. They will sort through tons of data and prepare a lab report. Meanwhile, we will start our month-long genetics unit.





7th Grade ELA

Students in ELA 7 have been reading Lyddie, the story of a Lowell, MA mill worker in the 1800s. We are learning about working conditions in factories during the American Industrial Revolution. Students will also be learning how to write an argument essay, citing textual evidence to determine whether Lyddie should risk her job to sign a petition for better working conditions.

8th Grade ELA

In 8th Grade ELA, students have completed their Shakespeare Magazine Projects! Students not only wrote a magazine article, but also had fun creating set designs, costumes, and advertisements for their magazines. Currently, we have started our new text, *Unbroken* by Laura Hillenbrand. In this unit, students will be learning a lot about the Pacific Theatre during World War II. We have teamed up with Social Studies so that students have the appropriate historical knowledge to understand this challenging novel. Students will be learning various note-taking and annotating strategies as they read articles and primary sources. Our goal is to give students practical reading skills that will prepare them for high school next year. Students are also going to have an increase in the amount of weekly homework and weekly reading so that they can become more independent and confident in their learning.





up the Chemistry unit that we started back in October. Students have been learning about bonds and how different chemicals bond with each other to make compounds and chemical reactions. On Valentines Day, the students all were able to be a specific ion and bond with another classmate (ion). Math has been an integral component of these last few concepts while students have had the challenge of balancing equations - they have used Legos to model how this actually works. In a few weeks, students will be starting the two month long physics unit and then we will have to begin preparing for the 8th grade state science test at the end of May and beginning of June. All students are encouraged to take this exam so that they can practice for their science Regents exams in high school and more importantly see where they stand in terms of their science knowledge throughout middle school.
