## Class Spotlight

Eight Grade English Language Arts

In 8th grade ELA, students have been reading both *Unbroken* by Laura Hillenbrand and *A Farewell to Manzanar* by Jeanne Wakatsuki Houston & James D. Houston. Through reading these texts, one about being a prisoner of war and the other about Japanese internment, students in 8th grade are being challenged to look at the same events through different perspectives. Students will explore common themes and evaluate how both prisoners of war and internees have had to be resilient, even



when they feel invisible. As a class, we have also read the United Nations *Universal Declaration of Human Rights* in order to see what rights all people should have and how to respect each other so these events are not repeated in our future. In an effort to apply these themes to our school, students have traced their hands and made a pledge on how they can stop hate and judgment in our school, and bring more compassion, kindness, perspective, and humanity to our school.

The eighth grade completed their Cars Unit. Students did an amazing job and we created the fastest cars that this school has ever seen!


I am proud of how hard the students worked on their cars and am looking forward to seeing how well they do with the final two units where we will study Aerodynamics and Buoyancy.


## Spanish 8
